Sunday, January 22, 9:30 a.m. The Art of the Anatolian Kilim: Highlights from the McCoy Jones Collection" The Anatolian flat-woven kilims on view, dating from the 15th to the 19th century, include a variety of design types and regional styles, as well as superb examples of artistic and visual prowess. The kilims in the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco's permanent collection are considered the most important group of Anatolian kilims outside Turkey. Cost: \$17 per person. We will enter the museum at the regular opening time, at the side entrance adjacent to the Pool of Enchantment.
