The book for **March** will be **The Pioneers: The Heroic Story of the Settlers Who Brought the American Ideal West** by David McCullough. "McCullough tells the history of the Ohio Territory as a story of uplift, of what can happen when the doers of good are let loose upon a place. This is American history as a vision of our better selves" (Joyce Chaplin, New York Times). The book for **April** will be **Snow Falling on Cedars** by David Guterson.
